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# 2013 State Election ‘Report Card’

## Introduction

On March 9, 2013, Western Australia will go to the polls to determine which party will lead the State for the next four years. While publicly and in the media, the election is being fought over transport and major infrastructure projects, it's important to remember what is really at stake when deciding the identity of our next leader.

The Western Australian Council of State School Organisations Inc. (WACSSO) believes that Education is the most important issue of this election.

WA has an excellent public education system that should be celebrated. However, WACSSO has identified a number of funding, resourcing and procedural shortfalls, that we believe if addressed, would improve the quality and outcomes in education for our State's children.

WACSSO produced a State Election Position Paper in August 2012, setting its position on several key issues pertinent to education in WA. This position paper has informed the nature of lobbying by WACSSO and its affiliates, more than 680 P&C Associations state-wide, to political candidates, members and parties, in the lead up to the election.

Each major political party has now released its key policies and vision for the future of education in our State. WACSSO also requested specific response from the WA Liberal Party, WA Labor Party, The Greens WA and The Nationals WA on each of the 14 issues addressed in its Position Paper. A combination of these responses and an in-depth analysis of each party's education-related announcements, commitments and policies is summarised in this "Election Report Card."

Please note that WACSSO did not receive specific feedback on some key issues from all parties and any unaddressed concerns will be noted in the document.

WACSSO encourages individuals to use this document as an aid in deciding who will receive their vote on March 9.

# Lifting the profile of public education

## Pride in the Public Education System

### POSITION:

- Public schools provide a high quality education and should be seen as schools of choice for WA families.
- The Department of Education and stakeholders should have pride and actively promote the public education system.
- School Expert Review Group (ERG) reports should not be broadly published, however they should be made readily available to the school staff, school community and to interested parties upon request.

## Information Communication Technology – Increased support funding for schools

### WACSSO CALLS FOR:

- Upgrade of SIS to web-based system and increased bandwidth for ALL schools.
- Implementation of the current Standard operating environment (SOE) in ALL schools.
- Permanent dedicated ICT support specialists located at each school based on a formula of 1 FTE for every 200 computers at that school.
- Flying squad of ICT support specialists based in the regional education offices to service remote communities
- Position titles and levels for ICT support staff to be standardised across the state and employment under the Public Service Award.
- FTE for these positions is funded centrally by the Department of Education.
- Ongoing and appropriate PD to be delivered to all staff.

### WACSSO CALLS FOR:





- Review of the school networking initiative in regard to its effectiveness in supporting local schools.
- Review of the Independent Public Schools to determine the adequacy of support and the ability for the Department of Education to monitor school effectiveness beyond NAPLAN data.
- Re-instatement of some roles (ie. Curriculum Manager, coordinator Regional Operations) related to school support and professional development (PD) in rural District Offices.

- Parents of students in IPS schools participating in the review be asked about any increase in parental engagement under this program.
- The State Government to increase school funding to schools to ensure public schools, both IPS and non-IPS, can provide a high quality education to WA students.

- Assessment of current public school boarding facilities and start construction of additional boarding facilities
- Teacher training for high school teachers who will teach Year 7 curriculum.
- The provision of appropriate transition to high school programs.
- Financial support for families of country students who will be forced to commence boarding school in Year 7.

- Pay and conditions for Dental Clinic staff, including dentists, dental therapists, dental clinic assistants and dental technicians be increased to assist in the attraction and retention of workers.

# Student Road Safety

## Provision of School Crossing Guards

### WACSSO CALLS FOR:

- Any school that requests a crossing guard should be provided with one immediately for an initial 6 month period while further assessments are carried out.
- The current formula to determine the need for a Type A crossing to be amended to take into account other risk factors such as road conditions, speed limits, types of vehicles using the road, pedestrian age and number of unsupervised crossings
- The State Government to investigate the provision of 'walk lights' at all schools without traffic guards.
